



FIP Daily Treatment Log

The daily record for the treatment course. One line a day: is the dose in, and how is your cat doing?

The eighty-four days of FIP treatment are made of small, steady, daily habits, and this sheet is one of them. Once a day you note that the dose has gone in, and a few ordinary things about how your cat is doing. That is it. Recovery from FIP is a trend rather than a moment, so a written line each day lets you see the gentle upward slope you cannot feel from inside the routine, and it turns "she seems a bit off" into something your vet can actually act on. It pairs with the free FIP Treatment Companion, which holds the same record on your phone.

THIS SHEET RECORDS THE DOSE. IT DOES NOT SET IT

The dose your cat needs is your vet's decision, worked out for your cat and kept right over time. This log is only for ticking that the dose your vet prescribed has been given, never for working out how much to give. FIP medicine should always come through your vet: that is the legal, quality-assured route, and it is the one that keeps the right diagnosis and the right dose together. If anything about the dose is ever unclear, ask your vet before the next one.

THE WEEKLY WEIGH-IN (THE ONE THAT QUIETLY PROTECTS EVERYTHING)

FIP most often strikes growing kittens, and as treatment works your kitten gains weight. Because the dose is set per kilogram, a dose that was right a few weeks ago can quietly become too small as your kitten grows, so weighing weekly is how that gets caught. Each week, weigh on the same kitchen scales, write the weight in, and share it with your vet, who adjusts the dose if it is needed. You never change the dose yourself: you weigh, you log, and you let your vet do the maths. Follow your vet's instruction on timing too (for example an empty stomach if they've advised it), and try to keep the dose to the same time each day.

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A returning or rising temperature, a real drop in appetite or energy, or being sick more than once is worth a call to your vet, not a wait-and-see.

How to use. One line a day: tick that the vet-prescribed dose went in, and note weight (weekly), appetite and energy. Weigh weekly and let your vet adjust the dose as your cat grows. This sheet records and never prescribes. A wellbeing aid, not a substitute for veterinary advice.
