



Questions to Ask Your Vet About FIP Treatment

FIP is treatable now, legally, through your own vet. The questions worth asking, with space for the answers

FIP used to mean goodbye. It does not any more. Antiviral treatment with GS-441524 and remdesivir is legal in the UK, prescribed by your own vet under the cascade and supplied through Bova UK, and most cats who complete a proper course come through it well. The mindset that works best in the room is partnership: you and your vet want the same thing. Take this sheet with you, write the answers as you go, and don't leave wishing you'd asked.

THE TREATMENT, AND THE LEGAL UK ROUTE

THE ROUTE, IN ONE LINE

FIP medicine is prescribed by a vet and supplied through Bova UK. That legal route is the one worth taking: it keeps the right diagnosis and the right dose together, and it is quality-assured. It is also the only version of this that these sheets support.

Is antiviral treatment (GS-441524 / remdesivir, via Bova UK under the cascade) something we can consider for my cat?

Have you treated FIP with these antivirals before? Would the current ISFM guidance or Bova's support help, or a referral to a vet who treats it regularly? (any of these is a good answer)

THE PLAN, AND THE MONITORING TO EXPECT

Which form would we start with, oral or injectable, and roughly how long is the course?

How often will you reweigh my cat and adjust the dose as they grow, and how will that work?

What recheck bloods should I expect, and roughly when (for example day 30, 60 and 84)? What are you watching, such as the A:G ratio and globulins?

After the course finishes, what does the observation window look like, and when would you recheck?

COST, INSURANCE, AND EVERYDAY CARE

Roughly what will the whole course cost, how is it billed over the weeks, and is it claimable on my insurance?

What side effects are normal and worth just noting, and what would mean calling you urgently?

ANYTHING ELSE I WANT TO ASK

How to use. Go in as a partner, not for a fight. FIP is treatable through your own vet on a legal UK route. Ask about the plan, the weekly reweigh, the bloodwork checkpoints, the cost and what to watch for. A wellbeing aid, not a substitute for veterinary advice.
