IF YOUR CUSHING'S PET TURNS UNWELL, HOLD THE DOSE AND CALL

A Cushing's pet on its medicine that goes off its food, vomits, has diarrhoea or turns weak or quiet may be getting too much. Do NOT give the next dose. Ring your vet the same day, urgently if they are really unwell. Over-suppression can tip into an Addisonian crisis, which is why this rule exists.

IF YOUR PET HAS ADDISON'S

The replacement medicine must never be missed, and some pets need an extra steroid dose at stressful times (travel, kennels, illness, surgery) on your vet's advice. Keep a few days' buffer and order repeats early. See the crisis card.
