



My Pet's Vaccination Record

A personal write-on record of which vaccines were given and when, core versus lifestyle, and what is next due

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Your vaccination certificate lives at the practice, but a copy in your own hands means you always know where things stand: what your pet has had, when, and when the next one is due. Vaccines split into two groups. **Core** vaccines protect against the serious, widespread diseases and, for the viral core, are now boosted no more often than every three years (WSAVA 2024). **Lifestyle (non-core)** vaccines are matched to how and where your pet lives, and several of these are genuinely annual.

WHICH IS WHICH (ASK YOUR VET TO CONFIRM FOR YOUR PET)

Dogs, core: parvovirus, distemper, infectious hepatitis (adenovirus).
Commonly lifestyle/annual: leptospirosis, kennel cough (Bordetella / parainfluenza), rabies for travel.

Cats, core: feline panleukopenia, cat flu (herpesvirus, calicivirus); FeLV is core for younger and outdoor cats. **Lifestyle:** as advised for your cat's lifestyle.

IF A TITRE IS PART OF YOUR PLAN, READ THIS

A titre test measures antibodies and can stand in for the **core viral** booster, but it covers **only parvovirus, distemper and hepatitis**. It says **nothing** about leptospirosis or kennel cough, which are killed/bacterial vaccines with shorter-lived immunity and still need boosting on their own schedule. A titre is a way to vaccinate appropriately, not a way to stop. Note too that kennels, catteries, insurers and the pet travel scheme may still require the actual vaccination certificate.
